Much has transpired in the six months since I signed on as Interim Rector. The Vestry has appointed a Rector Nominating Committee to lead the discernment process and has addressed other important matters of parish administration. More importantly, parish volunteers continue to look after

one another's interests, singing in the choir, as usher, gardener, lector, teacher, looking after the all important outreach ministries of the parish, and any of a number of other ministries.

Supported by diocesan volunteers, the nominating committee has held a series

of Holy Conversations to give them insights into the needs, wants, and goals of the parish and of the qualities needed in the new rector. A new web presence has been designed and is soon to be launched, a brochure about the parish is under development, a

suggestion box is now placed in the sanctuary, regular progress reports are made to the congregation, and critical vacancy notices have been approved by the Bishop, soon to be published. All this bodes well for a satisfying outcome.

The interim period is a period of transition in the life of a parish. I am looking forward to working with a newly formed Worship Committee to look after matters of common concern: gaining a familiarity with liturgical developments and the re-introduction of Eucharistic visitors among them. The Jr. Warden is convening a committee to form a long-term plan to assure that facilities are kept in good repair, a committee is working with the parish secretary to better organize parish files, a web site committee is guiding development work, and the vestry has upgraded the office copier, computer printers, and software.

The Fall schedule will resume on Sunday, August 22. I enjoyed the challenges of leading the adult education class in the Spring and am looking forward to engaging in many lively discussions when classes resume.

It appears that my work here may go on for several more months. Since I have some long standing commitments that take me out of the Commonwealth from time to time, I have made provisions for coverage on Sundays through the month of November, with a priest when available, and with a lay worship leader (Lay Reader) when not.

A parish in transition is a parish on the move, and some day my time will come

to move on. For now, I am delighted to be a part of life at Trinity.

Financial Report

July was close to budget for both income and expense. Pledge income was about \$2,000 behind for the month and remains about \$2,500 behind through July. Any effort by members to catch up fulfilling their pledges will enhance our cash flow during this time. Expenses year-to-date are about \$7,500 over budget, but the bulk of that related to the dishwasher for which we had offsetting directed income.

Personnel expenses continue below budget for the month and YTD. This will probably continue as we had budgeted for a new rector (at a cost higher than our interim) effective in September. Based on our timing in the search process, the interim situation will probably continue longer into the fall. We need to prepare ourselves for 2011, however, when personnel costs will be higher. Most other expenses were in line with budget.

Your continued support is appreciated. Remember that our budget was out of balance to begin the year. Although we have made progress, we have recently adjusted the budget to include estimated costs associated with the rector search process.

Rector Nominating Committee Progress

Trinity's Rector Search Committee reached a milestone in the process of

finding a new rector. In order for our rector position to be officially open, a completed "Parish/Institution Search Request" form had to be approved by Trinity's vestry and Bishop Sauls. The committee assembled the information gathered from the Holy Conversations and compiled it onto the form. The vestry approved it on July 23 and the bishop on July 24. The form is found on pages 5 - 7 – please contact a member of the committee with questions or concerns.

The Rector Nominating process is described on Trinity's website. Over the next few weeks Bishop Sauls will receive applications for our rector position. At the end of that time, he will forward the five likely candidates to the committee for reviews, visits, and interviews.

If you have a question, a suggestion, or want to give us the name of someone who is willing to be considered for Rector of Trinity Church, please see a member of the Committee (Bob Webster, Dave Seidel, Jack Pogue, Lisa Nesmith, Elaine Hammonds, JP Brantley, Clara Bleier) or drop it into the box at the back of the church.

As always, thank you for your continued support and please keep us, the nominees, and the Bishop in your prayers.
