Pentecost 2010

Pentecost is about power. It is about the power of the resurrected Christ expressed in the community of faith and of the faithful. It is about the power of faith over fear. Such is God's provision for those who trust in him in times of uncertainty and adversity. When we come our wits end, then God bears us

up in ways that usually surprise, often bewilder, but rarely disappoint us.

The church was born on that Pentecost following the resurrection. Mary, mother of Jesus, other women, the remaining eleven disciples, and scores more gathered in Jerusalem – one hundred

twenty we are told. Not knowing where to turn, they gathered to pray – an apt approach in any time of uncertainty. God answered their prayers, speaking to them, and through them in ways they could not have anticipated.

(Cont.) So too it is for us when we are at our wits end. We gather to pray, expectant to be sure, but ever attentive to the holy spirit -- that unpredictable, creative, surprising, and energizing work of God among those who wait upon and act upon godly initiative.

During the first three Wednesday evenings of June, the vestry and newly formed search committee will sponsor a series of Holy Conversations. These are planned as occasions for those committed to the future of Trinity Church to gather for prayer, to listen to one another, to speak from our diverse personal perspectives, and to engage what is called a process of discernment: who are we as Trinity Church and what are our hopes and dreams.

Naturally, I plan to attend all three evenings. Each covers a different aspect of parish life. My role will be primarily as one who has come to pray and to listen. It is your voices that your search committee will want to hear. From them they will write up a word picture of the people of Trinity Church, so laying essential groundwork for seeking -- and eventually selecting -- a new rector.

May God continue to grant us grace to know his holy spirit working within us, among us, and through us.

FINANCIAL REPORT

April was a relatively good month for Trinity from a financial perspective. Pledge income was strong for the month and YTD is even with budget. Good income from ECW was included in April with most of it earmarked for the new dishwasher.

Personnel expenses were slightly below budget for the month and YTD. Our obligations to Father Rob are now complete. Most other expenses were in line with budget. Overall we showed a gain for the month versus a budgeted loss. YTD we are running about \$14,500 ahead of budget showing roughly a \$5,000 loss versus almost a \$20,000 loss for four months.

We ask for your continued support, as we will have unbudgeted expenses related to the Rector Search process as it unfolds over the next few months. — Jeff Thornton

Although Boys and Girls will attend during the same week, Boys will be doing the Mission portion of the camp while the Girls are doing the Adventure portion and mid-week, they will switch.

If your children have completed the first grade, they are eligible for Co-Ed "Mini"- Camps 1 or 2, June 20-23 or June 23-26.

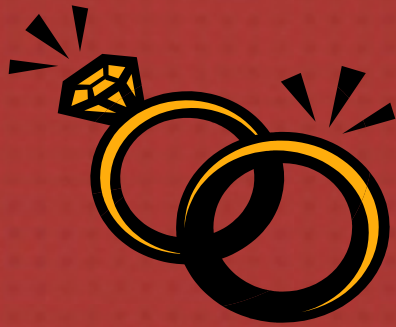
